Preface: God instituted the first Thanksgiving Festival to be observed by the Nation of Israel. Since He ordained that His children, Israel, express gratitude to Him for the manifold blessings He heaped upon them daily, we can learn how to celebrate and express appropriate thanks to God for His great blessings to us individually and as a nation by studying God's instructions to Israel. Since all Scripture is profitable, its writing being inspired by the Holy Ghost, we have the privilege to learn, through what God has revealed in His Word, about the true thanksgiving and how to practice it. As we look more closely at Israel's Thanksgiving celebration and at the other lessons in this booklet, we will learn more about the kind of gratitude we need to have springing up in our heart and flowing out of our mouth to God. We live in a day of gross ingratitude, but we do not have to let ourself become like the world. Once we understand how far short we are falling, we can repent and let Jesus Christ fill our heart with the same overflowing gratitude that He has for His Heavenly Father. May God bless the words of this book to your heart and life.—The Author Chapter One: The First Thanksgiving – The Book of Leviticus records the account of the first Thanksgiving Festival. This feast, known as the Feast of Tabernacles, was attended by Israel, the LORD's natural Bride. Just as our own Thanksgiving, the Feast of Tabernacles was celebrated at the close of the harvest season in Canaan's Land. Also in the fifteenth day of the seventh month, when ye have gathered in the fruit of the land, ye shall keep a feast unto the LORD seven days: on the first day shall be a sabbath, and on the eighth day shall be a sabbath. And ye shall take you on the first day the boughs of goodly trees, branches of palm trees, and the boughs of thick trees, and willows of the brook; and ve shall rejoice before the LORD vour God seven days. And ye shall keep it a feast unto the LORD seven days in the year. It shall be a statute forever in your generations: ye shall celebrate it in the seventh month. Ye shall dwell in booths seven days; all that are Israelites born shall dwell in booths: That your generations may know that I made the children of Israel to dwell in booths, when I brought them out of the land of Egypt: I am the LORD your God. And Moses declared unto the children of Israel the feasts of the LORD (Leviticus 23:39-44). The Hebrew word for booth is sook-kaw, meaning a hut or lair of entwined boughs, booth, cottage, covert, den, pavilion, tabernacle, tent. In Egypt and in Canaan's Land, the children of Israel lived in houses; in the wilderness phase of their journey, they experienced living in tents or booths. After leaving their homes in Rameses, the Israelites set up their first tent encampment in Succoth, which is called the place of booths. The children of Israel had no permanent dwelling place during their years of wandering in the wilderness. The LORD's own House was called a Tabernacle, and the tribes of Israel encamped in tents around the LORD's Tabernacle. Encircling and overshadowing all the tents was the LORD's Pillar of Cloud and Fire. The Mosaic Tabernacle, in the center of the tents of Israel, was spiritual in its ministry; nevertheless, it belonged to the natural realm because its furniture was built and set up by man. Israel's real booth in the wilderness was the spiritual one that overshadowed all the natural tents. Without the protection and blessing of the Living Booth of the LORD's Pillar of Cloud and Fire, none of the Israelites would have survived to enter into the Promised Land. The foundation of Israel's experience with the Pillar of Cloud and Fire in the wilderness was the lamb's blood that they applied to the door posts of their homes in Egypt. Likewise, the booth experience in the wilderness formed the foundation for many of the blessings Israel received in Canaan's Land. After Israel had entered into Canaan's Land, the LORD instituted the annual Feast of Tabernacles or booths in order to give His natural Bride an opportunity to express thanksgiving to Her Bridegroom for her spiritual foundation that was made up of all His past blessings to her. The Feast of Tabernacles started on the fifteenth day of the first month, at which time Israel offered offerings made by fire. The whole burnt offerings on the Brazen Altar speak of the fiery love and consecration that the Bride of Jesus Christ is to offer to her Spiritual Bridegroom. The freewill offerings brought on this occasion speak of the voluntary, spontaneous spirit which the Bride is to manifest. The LORD does not receive offerings that are given grudgingly or presented out of a sense of dreary obligation. The four classes of trees that Israel used in making her booths, in order to celebrate the Feast of Tabernacles, portray the "house of praise" in which the spiritual Bride is to live as she passes through this world.

The sign of Scorpio is the third prophetic light in the sky. The nature of this sign is seen in the Old Testament tribe of Gad. God's blessings of power granted to Scorpio is reflected in the diamond stone. **I. Description of the Sign** The constellation of Scorpio can be seen in God's Prophetic Calendar between Libra and Sagittarius. Bearing the similitude of a scorpion or serpent, this southern constellation symbolizes death and deceit. When man fell from God's Scales of Justice (the point of equilibrium) to degradation and death by the Serpent, he entered into the painful experience of being bitten continually by the Serpent. II. The Sign's Relationship to God's Prophetic Calendar The sign of Scorpio speaks

prophetically not only of man's continual harassment from the Serpent's bite but also of the time that the Serpent, fallen Lucifer, would bite the Heel of the Man Jesus, Who was our Substitute at Calvary's Cross. If

man had perceived the significance of this sign, he would not have been surprised that the Holy, Powerful Heel of Jesus refused the Serpent's sinful poison and that Jesus, in turn, placed His nail-torn Heel upon the Serpent's head of deceitful wisdom, bringing a death to it. In the eyes of unbelieving men, the Death of Jesus signified the disgraceful end of the Galilean pretender of divinity. But, Resurrection Morning declared His triumph as Life overcame Death, Now is the judgment of this world: now shall the prince of this world be cast out. And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me. This he said, signifying what death e should die (John 12:31-33).

IV. The Tribe and Stone of Sagittarius – The nature of the light of the sign of Sagittarius was imparted to the Old Testament tribe of Ephraim, son of Joseph, whose bow abode in strength and whose arms of his hands were made strong by the mighty God of Jacob. We see in Joseph, Egyptian ruler and lawgiver, the powerful arrows of authority which were passed on to Ephraim. During Israel's wilderness journey to Canaan's Land, Ephraim encamped on the west side of the Tabernac-

le in the Head-realm position by the Ark of God which contained the arrows of God's Law or Word. The tribe of Ephraim was identified with the ligure stone. Let us consider Jacob's blessings to Joseph, for they naturally would include Joseph's son Ephraim. Joseph is a fruitful bough, even a fruitful bough by a well; whose branches run over the wall: The archers have sorely grieved him, and shot at him,

and hated him: But his bow abode in strength, and the arms of his hands were made strong by the hands of the mighty God of Jacob; (from thence is the shepherd, the stone of Israel:) Even by the God of thy father, who shall help thee; and by the Almighty, who shall bless thee with blessings of heaven above, blessings of the deep that lieth under, blessings of the breasts, and of the womb: (Genesis 49:22-25).

Gad—Meaning troop, those belonging to the tribe of Gad pray for the final victory over the enemy, as the tribes work with Christ to overcome (Genesis 49:19; Deuteronomy 33:20).

Dan – Meaning to judge, those belonging to the tribe of Dan help to maintain balance and equilibrium by weighing the scales of God's justice and judgment through wisdom, courage, and strength that comes from the Word and praying for others (Genesis 49:16-17; Deuteronomy 33:22).

Asher—Meaning happy and blessed, those belonging to the tribe of Asher share the abundance that the LORD has blessed them with and are willing to serve (Genesis 49:20; Deuteronomy 33:24-25).



Naphtali – Meaning to wrestle or fight, those belonging to the tribe of Naphtali are prevailing ones, who will continue to pray when others give up (Genesis 49:21; Deuteronomy 33:23).



Benjamin—Meaning son of the right hand, those belonging to the tribe of Benjamin display the twofold nature of the LORD—humility and exaltation—as they pray for Christ's second coming (Genesis 49: 27; Deuteronomy 33:12).



Joseph—Ephraim—Meaning fruitfulness, those belonging to the tribe of Ephraim depict blessing and fruitfulness that God desires to give in the natural and the spiritual, as they recognize and care for the concerns of those in need (Genesis 49:22-25; Deuteronomy . 33-13-17).

Joseph—Manasseh—Meaning to forget, those belonging to the tribe of Manasseh pray for others to forgive and forget through humility (Genesis 49:22-26; Deuteronomy 33:13-17).

Levi—Meaning to be joined to, those belonging to the tribe of Levi join in prayer for those who have a hard time being faithful to what God is doing in all the tribes (Genesis 49:5-7; Deuteronomy 33:8-11).

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Sermon Study # 1 9 8 8 FOUR CLASSES OF GIVING IN PSALM 100 — 4TH MESSAGE (SAT P M 7 / 2 1 / 2 0 0 1) (Fayettesville, NC.)

The message continues to discuss the natural and spiritual aspects of giving of our firstfruits, our tithes, our offerings, and our half shekel. Lifting up the LORD's Name is our birthright. Moses lifted up the LORD's Name three times on the pleasure side of the scales. (1) In Exodus, chapter seven, Moses lifted up the Rod of the LORD's judgmental Name over Pharaoh, and all the water in the streams, rivers, ponds, and pools was turned to blood. (2) In Exodus, chapter fourteen, Moses lifted up the Rod over the Red Sea. (3) In Exodus, chapter seventeen: Aaron and Hur held up Moses' arms so that he could hold up the rod in the battle against Amalek. This was a battle of the Brotherhood. The one time Moses lifted up the rod on the pain side of the Scales is recorded in Numbers, chapter twenty. Here, Moses lifted up his hand, and with his rod smote the Rock twice, when he was supposed to speak to it. Thus, Moses missed it on his strong point. We, too, often miss it on our strong points. FOUR CLASSES OF GIVING IN PSALM 100 — 5TH MESSAGE (SU N A M 7 / 2 2 / 2 0 0 1) (Fayetteville, NC.)

The spiritual counterpart of giving offerings is thankfulness, which is crowned with the LORD's hode glory above the heavens, above creation, in the Father's realm. Psalm 8:1,2 reveals that spiritual babes and sucklings are in this realm. The Son of God was small in the bosom of the Father. Yet, He came to earth so that we could grow big in His stature and become a Bride and a Manifested Son of God and learn to become small enough to go back to the bosom of the Father and be a servant both now and in eternity. Second Samuel, chapter twelve, gives us an example in David's life of how to repent in the Son's realm over the cause of sin and how to repent in the Father's realm over the effect of sin. In the Son's realm, the High Priest convicts our heart, and the King convinces the shaft of our will. In the Father's realm, God the Father, the Prophet, prophesies and shows us the effect of what our sin has done to Him, to His Word, to His Name, to His Glory above the Heavens, and to His very bosom, from which all things have been born. Spiritual Meanings of Animals In Our Dreams: Wolf—Devouring, Greedy Spirit—The Hebrew word for wolf is *zeh-abe*, which means to be yellow. Wolves are a suitable picture of the Judges and Priests of Jerusalem who showed no mercy in their greedy devouring of the people. Wolves, which are ferocious animals, prowl at night in search of prey to satisfy their ravenous hunger. They devour all they kill, then eagerly await the next night so that they again can try to appease their insatiable appetites. The Judges and Priests in Israel exhibited wolf-like natures because they deceitfully, greedily, and unmercifully devoured the substance of the people to whom they ministered.



Spiritual Meanings of Numbers in God's Word: The Number TWELVE Is the Number of GOD'S Perfect GOVERNMENT: 1. There were twelve Patriarchs (Acts 7:8). 2. Jesus called twelve Apostles (Matthew 10:2). 3. The High Priest's Breastplate contained twelve stones (Exodus 28:15:29). 4. The Table of Shewbread held twelve cakes of Shewbread (Leviticus 24:5-9). 5. Twelve men were sent to spy out Canaan's Land (Numbers 13:1-16). 6. Jesus was twelve years of age when He went to the Temple to take over His Father's business



(Luke 2:42). 7. Jesus told his Disciples that He could ask His Father for twelve legions of Angels to defend Him (Matthew 26:53). 8. In the Apostle John's description of the New Jerusalem, he told that the names of the twelve tribes of Israel were written in the wall and that the names of the twelve Apostles were written in its twelve foundations (Revelation 21:19-21). 9. The Tree of Life in the New City bears twelve manner of fruits, and its yields fruit every month (Revelation 22:2). 10. Jacob had twelve sons who founded the Nation of Israel (Genesis 35:22-26). 11. Twelve baskets of food were taken up after the feeding of the five thousand (Matthew 14:20).

The Number FIFTY Is God's Number of PENTECOST or the HOLY GHOST. 1. Fifty days separated the Feast of the Passover from the Feast of Pentecost (Leviticus 23:15, 16; Acts 2:1-4). 2. Fifty loops were made in the curtains of the Tabernacle (Exodus 26:5). 3. Fifty loops were made in the edge of the curtain that was coupled to the second curtain (Exodus 26:10). 4. Fifty tacks of gold coupled the curtains together (Exodus 26:6).
